## OSWALD SAID TO SAY HE BROKE SINGLE LAW

HE BROKE SINGLE LAW

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23
(AP)—A Dallas detective told the Warren Commission that Lee Harvey Oswald contended that he had broken only one law in his life.

The testimony of Capt. Will Fritz was released Monday. In it the quoted Oswald, the assassin of President Kennedy, as having said:

"I hit the officer in the [motion picture] show; he hit me in the eye and I guess he deserved it.

"That is the only law I violated. That is the only thing I have done wrong."

Captain Fritz's testimony detailed his hours of questioning Oswald, He was in charge of the case for the Dallas police.

In his testimony, Captain Fritz said the first time he interviewed Oswald the suspect protested against questioning by an agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The agent, James Patrick Hosty, testified his presence upset Oswald, but said he asked no questions.
