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I do not share the findings of the Commission as to the

probability that both President Kennedy and Governor Connally

were struck by the same bullet. The expert testimony, based on

measurements and surveys, including reconstruction of the motortrip

of the Presidential party on that fateful November 22nd presents

a persuasive case. However, the movement of one of the victims

by either leaning forward or to either side or rising a few inches

from his seat would have made a considerable difference in the

mathematical computations.

I join my colleagues in the belief that three shots were

fired but, to me, the testimony of Governor Connally that he heard

the first shot fired and strike the President and turned before he

himself was wounded makes more logical a finding that the first

and third shots struck the President and the second shot wounded

Governor Connally. Reviewing the Kapruder film several times adds



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
