Dear Mr. Harrison:

For the record, I think an item you carried in the Star of June 6 should be amplified and clarified.

About two months ago, told me the following story when I asked him for a comprehensive explanation of the statement the late Senator had made in California, that he was satisfied with the Warren Report:

What a politician says when he is running for office is not necessarily what he does once elected. Bobby has to say now what cannot be true "because there are already too many guns between him and the White House".

The inference was unmistakable. These were Establishment, not anti-Establishment, guns.

I told Jim Garrison, who presumably told Mark Lane. When this subject came up on Channel 14 last Tuesday night, I told this story.

I think the significant thing here is, first, the inference of an expected assassination and, second, that telling the truth about the assassination of John Kennedy increased the possibility of an assassination of Robert Kennedy.
