Irving Jaffe; Saxbe; "Executive Privelege"

Today's WzPost story, "Ervin Says Saxbe Broke His Possise," merely identifies Irving Jaffe as "asting assistant Attorney General." Jaffe made a statement in support of DJ intervention in the case between the Wassgatte Committee and Mixon on the tapes. In addition to the pleadings in the court of appeals by the Office of the Special Prosecutor, which the story does not say is part of DJ.

Jaffe, in civil, increased intertoiter approximately was one of the crew that did the job with the Fisher panel. He is one who was filled with doubts about the whole matter and went to Baltimore to be bucked up by Fisher in the last minute. He shared an office with Carl Eardley, who seems to have been chief DJ legal assassinations areas. Eardley appeared in court on these matters (Halleck) and on papers (my CA 718-70).

"onaistent with his assassinations record and the requirements of legal finkery, Jaffe's statement is that helping Nizon and having the Department support his position in court is not helping him and not taking sides because the Department is interested in "principle" only, a principle without Constitutional or legislated base.

So Jaffe's and DJ's honesty in this "executive privelege" matter can be evaluated, this flashback to the use and misuse they made of the until-then suppressed panel report.

It utterly, completely and foever destroys the Warren eport, the integrity of the Commission and of each individual with any association with the medical-sapsects part of the investigation. Jaffe and company said and argued in court that it affirms the conclusions of the commission.
