F Post 2/14/77 Watergate burglar living in Colorado

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (AP) - Convicted Watergate burglar James W. McCord Jr. is now living quietly with his wife and two daughters in this northern Colorado college town.

"They are very personable and friendly," said one of their neighbors, who asked not to be identified. "He likes to chitchat about golf and so on. They haven't really tried to hide their

past and who they are."

The Denver Post reported Sunday that McCord and members of his family refused requests for interviews. McCord's daughter Anne is reportedly a graduate student at Colorado State University, the newspaper said.

McCord was one of five men arrested inside the Watergate offices of the democratic National Committee on June 17, 1972. He was convicted of conspiracy and sentenced to five years in prison by U.S. District Judge John Sirica, but served less than four months before Sirica reduced his sentence and ordered his release.
