Ehrlichman to Be Witness In Watergate-Related Trial

John Ehrlichman, serving a prison sentence in Arizona for his part in the Watergate cover-up, is to testify today or Tuesday in the New York trial of another Watergate figure.

Anthony T. Ulasewicz, a former New York City policeman, is charged in a federal indictment with understating his income in 1971 and 1972. He is alleged to have been the go-between in payments to burglars who broke into Democratic National Committee headquarters at Watergate.

Ehrlichman flew to New York yesterday from Phoenix. He was accompanied by two federal marshals who drove him to the ramp of a waiting jet. Reporters, kept inside the passengers' waiting room by a federal agent, were not allowed any contact with him.

Ehrlichman has refused all requests for interviews since entering prison. He is serving 2½ to 8 years at the federal prison camp at Safford, Ariz., on charges of conspiracy, obstruction of justice and perjury. He entered the minimum security facility Oct. 28.
