ANTITANK GUN, MORTAR FOUND 20-Ton Weapon Cache Seized

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Federal agents and police, helped by the U.S. Army, seized at least 20 tons of assorted weaponry last night in an otherwise empty \$200,000 mansion and arrested a woman in the house.

She was Mrs. Louis Thoresen, 30, charged under a San Francisco ordinance forbidding possession of automatic weapons and storing ammunition without a permit. She was freed on \$1,100 bail.

Her husband, William Thor-

sen III, 30, is being sought on a New York City federal warrant charging him with violation of federal gun laws, according to U.S. Atty. Cecil Poole. His whereabouts are not known, Poole said.

THREE TRUCKS from the San Francisco Presidio Army base were needed to carry the weapons from the mansion.

Included were a 37mm antitank gun on a wheeled carriage, an 81mm mortar, numerous submachine guns,

cases of grenades, 20mm rifles, boxes of rifles and hand guns and ammunition.

No explanation for the weapons was given by Poole.

THE SEARCH warrant for the raid was produced by the federal alcohol and tobacco tax unit, which normally handles interstate gun cases.

The couple's attorney, Jake Erlich, said, "Thoresen . . . just likes to collect old weapons."

Mrs. Thoresen was led from
