Dear Cyril,

The date of publication was 1965 or 1966. I am not certain but I think the author was a lawyer named Schwartz perhaps from Wisconsin. What I remember most clearly from it is his observation that one could not be favorably disposed to both the CP and the SWP at the same time. The Commission disclosed letters Oswald wrote each the same day. The author said that should have been investigated and should have been commented on by the Commission, as I now recall.

My health unfortunately, is not stable. Of the new developments I'm to be sent to Hopkins for polyp examination/removal. I learned this Friday. My family doctor is due back in his office tomorrow. He is to make the arrangements.

An iron deficiency showed on the blood tests. There has never been any occult blood and there was none Friday.
