Dear Cyril,

Thanks for your note of the 7th.

Sylvia would like to read POST MORTEM. Instead of returning it to me when you have finished with it, would you please send it to her? If you have any suggestions, I'd welcome them. I plan an addition to include some of the material I mentioned to you in DC. I have already prepared much of the projected appendix. It includes every document quoted.

If it is not too much trouble, with the destructive capacity of the modern post, I'd appreciate it if you would either register the book or send it book rate, insured for \$50.00. It costs me 20 cents a page for xeroxing, and if I have to replace it, the cost will be about that.

I plan to add a chapter to POST MORTEM III: SECRETS OF THE KENNEDY AUTOPSY to cover the 2/14 proceeding. Bud got the morning session and I will include lengthy excerpts from your testimony. He has sent a copy to someone who may be interested in helping. When you want to read it or COUP D'ETAT, let me know and I'll send either. I am not as short on copies of them.

The indictment of Andrews has a merit not immediately apparent. It is warranted and it permits the subpoenaing of out-of-state witnesses. The two I anticipate will resist are going to plead the fifth amendment, which will be very helpful for there is no doubt that were they to testify they would incriminate themselves. We have a witness who heard one attempt to bribe Andrews.

I have heard nothing from New Orleans. Notice of the new Andrews charge is in the States-Item of 3/6, which arrived this a.m. There should have been two additional charges of perjury against Shaw. I am not happy that he was charged so soon but he did perjure himself, as did others not yet charged.
