Dear Mr. Wegrocki,

As of now all I can do is express a willingness to meet with you and the teacher on the 20th. I do suggest that you phone before you leave. Things can come up that I now cannot anticipate.

I would appreciate it if you would have in mind what you want to ask me and keep it to the minimum because I really am pressed for time and have no help. If it is a nice day I may even be mowing when you get here because that, too, gets ahead of me and I have five acres to try to keep under control.

In addition, I am involved in two court appeals and trying to rush another book out. With the regular day-to-day work this is a heavy load. The only way I can hope to begin to cope with it is to stick to what is essential to me to the degree I can.

If I have not told you how to get here take the I70-US40W combination to exit 6W in Frederick. The road from Baltimore has both numbers.

When you leave at Exit 6W you will still be on 40W. You will have looped under the road you have been on. Go one block to the Holiday Inn, Baughman's Lane and turn right.

In a little over a half mile there is a four-way stop at Shookstown Road. Turn left on Shookstown for about 2 miles.

At Old Receiver Road turn right for about .3 miles. We are there on the right.

A few suggestions: once you get to Frederick I 70 starts up again. Don't take it.

There is a poorly-marked fork on Old Receiver. Stay to the left. Right after that there are woods on both sides. Those on the right are mine. You will come to a new large galvanized mailbox with no name on it and a Washington Post box on top of it. This is ours. About two lengths past that is the lane. You can't see the house from the road.
