Due to the nearness of completion of the work on which you have been engaged in Washington under the Agricultural Adjustment Administration, I am sorry to notify you that you will be furloughed without pay, for a period of three months, from the position of Junior Clerk in the Agricultural Adjustment Administration at a salary of \$1440 per annum to take effect at the expiration of such leave of absence with pay as may have accrued in your case, on the basis of 2 1/6 days for each month of actual service; leave of absence with pay to commence with May 1, 1937.

The necessity of sending you this notice is deeply regretted, and should it be necessary for us at a future date to increase our force along the line of your experience, we shall be happy to give consideration to the question of your restoration to the pay roll, should you desire at that time to return to our service.

It is our earnest hope, however, that you will be successful in finding other employment, and we want you to feel that we hold ourselves in readiness to assist you in every possible way.
