It is understood that the oly thing that keeps the Trits Mills plant from being a 100% union shop is the present officers. of the local.

It is understood Sat night that there are now 42 paid up members in the Sun Rubber Local and that these men want a charter, but the org. committee of the Barberton GLU. are trying to diswade them till they have at least 75 paid up. these are all men so far It was understood tho that the men can not be held off much longer and that a charter will be gotten within the next week or ten days.

It was told that the benifit given Sat. Night for the Insulator and Boxboard boys was a flop, financialy. there was too small a croud, but as a good time for those that were there. some 80 to 90 people, they all had a good time.
