I first wrote you concerning Myers from Akron, Ohio, during the Rubber Workers Convention. At the time I had no typewriter and having written in longhand, I retained no cabbon copy.

As I recall, I referred you to a member of the Automobile Workers Union, I believe Homer Martin. I am certain the office of the person to whim I referred you was in the Hoffman Building. From the person to whim I referred you, I was told, you can obtain a picture of Myers, his personal history, and indications of where he is now operating. Myers works for National Corporation Service of Youngstown, Ohio. When President of the General Tire Local in Akron, he was exposed. Our preliminary hearings state he got \$200.00 a month salary and an annual bonus of from \$1,000.00 to \$1,200.00 for a special report on the rubber industry.

The Rubber workers led me to believe that he is a spy in the automobile industry.
