Washington, Dec. 4. The official record of the La Follette Civil Liberties Committee of the United States Senate, including testimony of its recent hearings and a list of more than 250 labor spies, will go to press some time next week, Robert Wohlforth, secretary to the committee, announced today.

Copies of the hearings, Mr. Wohlforth said, will be available through the Government Printing Office.

The La Follette Committee has been investigating violations of the ~~the~~ right of labor to organize, ~~the~~ bargain collectively and picket peacefully. Hearings will be resumed in January.
