and other federal agencies of government.
In 1967 he was one of 10 employees fired by State
Department during 1967 because loyalty sur-
veillance showed he was not allowed to resign.
Reason given is nature of his background.

The Attorney General filed action demanding
removal of papers employed in extradition of
James Earl Ray, murderer of Martin Luther
King, Jr. Papers include affidavits from FBI
and Government examinations, and other aspects
of investigation. If approved, Civil
Division will be advised that we interpose
no objection, but suggest matter be referred
to Civil Rights Division since Federal
jurisdiction still outstanding on Ray on the
Federal Civil Rights charge.

Mr. Weisberg, author of Whitemash I and II, has
filed the above action demanding copies of all the papers
which were employed in the extradition of James Earl Ray.
These papers were furnished the State Department, flown
to England, presumably used in the extradition proceedings,
returned to the State Department, and then transferred to
the Department of Justice. Included in the papers are a
considerable number of affidavits of F.B.I. agents covering
fingerprints, ballistics, etc. A memorandum describing the
material being requested is attached.

Would you kindly advise whether the release of these
documents would in any way prejudice the work of the F.B.I.
and whether in your judgment their production should be
assisted.
