Dear Mr. Sokol,

I seem to have mislaid a letter I recall getting from you. I had put it aside until I heard from the travel bureau. Having heard nothing from them I phoned this morning. Subject to availability (and I presume I'll know if the flights are not available before I mail this) I am leaving Washington at 5 p.m. the 14th on a United non-stop flight that arrives at Rochester at 5:54 p.m. I am told Rochester is closer to Geneva than Buffalo. Unless I hear otherwise from you, I will expect someone to meet me at the Rochester airport. I'm looking forward to it.
