Dear Mr. Teplin,

What you propose in your letter of November 2 is acceptable. I particularly look forward to a seminar, for I have been impressed by the phone calls, letters and personal questions from the college generation.

The broad topic is, of course, the Kennedy assassination. However, in my book (and its unpublished sequel, now being typeset) I approach the assassination in terms of the functioning of the Commission.

As of now, any time during the two weeks ending December 17 is free.

Do you expect a prepared lecture or an informal one? With or without a question period (my experience is that college students prefer being able to ask questions, almost without end)? Would you prefer that I try and cover the essence of the entire thing or take one or two specialized aspects?

Often the organizations ask that books be available. When this happens and there is no conflict (as with your bookstore) the organization gets the bookstore profit, 40%. If your bookstore does not have an adequate supply, we can take care of that under normal trade arrangements (here I speak as my publisher).
