

Investigator talks today about Kennedy murder

Harold Weisberg, principal investigator for New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison, will discuss the Kennedy assassination and the Garrison investigation, at 11 a.m. today in the Union main ballroom.

Weisberg is the author of "Whitewash," one of the first books to challenge the conclusions of the Warren Commission, and has also done the most extensive writing on the subject, according to Gary Schoener, psychology graduate student and Garrison investigator.

SCHOENER BEGAN the two-part series on the Kennedy assassination Monday by reconstructing the assassination through slides, pictures, and tape recordings. He presented evidence and experts' studies showing contradictions in the Warren Report which prompted Garrison's investigation.

"Many investigators of the assassination feel Weisberg is the most knowledgeable person on the subject and the contributor of the most important independent research," Schoener said.

"WEISBERG IS the hub of the Garrison investigation. With the possible exception of Garrison himself, no one is more qualified to speak on the subject of the conspiracy to kill Pres. Kennedy."

Weisberg has had previous experience as an investigator and political analyst during the early days of World War II.

HIS FINDINGS exposed Nazi use of cartels for political and military intelligence and were widely credited with laying the foundation for the confiscation of enemy property and control of foreign funds.

The Justice and Treasury Depts. used the evidence he developed in legal and other actions against Nazi fronts, and he received commendations from the President, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, and 50 members of Congress.
