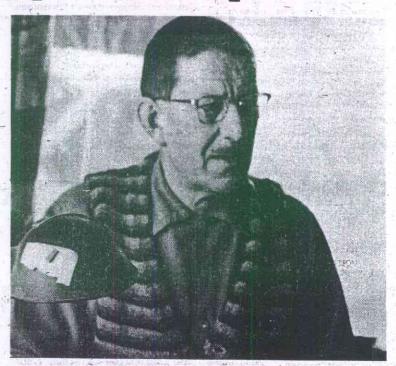
## JFK Expert to Speak

Harold Weisberg is America's leading Warren Commission and JFK researcher and investigator. He is the author of four books dealing with the President's assassination.

Harold Weisberg is the only person working in the field of assassinations who has really devoted himself to both research and investigation for the past eleven years. He has exhausted the information stored in the National Archives and has moved the J.F.K. investigation into the courts. Weisberg invented the underground book to bring out the first book on the Warren Commission and J.F.K. assassinations. The book, WHITEWASH, is one of the two basic books on the subject.

Weisberg has become the researcher who has made most use of the Freedom of Information Act. By it and by the threat of it he has forced the production of what had been suppressed since the J.F.K. assassination in great volume. Right now he has the F.B.I. in federal district court in a case that has the potential of ending acceptance of the official account of the J.F.K. assassination.
