Excerpts from "The Day Kennedy Was Shot" concerning notes at the sautopsy

Page 452: "The doctors began to speak their observations; notes were taken."

Page 472: "They (the gentlemen of science (i.e. the doctors -P.H.)) made small and sometimes indecipherable notes on pade."

(Page 482: Concerns signing of the autopsy authorisation by RFK.)

Page 513: "Himes made notes on pads; sometimes Boswell made notes on the same sheets..."

Page 546: "The notes kept by the doctors were in scribbles, sometimes only a phrase to remind them of an entire event (sic): "Blood & hair upper medias" "only a few in size 3-5 mm." "no missile in the wound" ... Doctor Humes leaned across(4c)" [All from 17H29; notes on call to Perry !!!!)

Page 582: "Doctor Humes, in his preliminary notes (sic), courted the same easy conclusion: "The pattern was clear," he stated. "One bullet had entered the President's back and had worked its way out of the body during external cardiac massage, and a second had been been high-velocity bullet had entered the rear of the skull and had fragmentised prior to exit through the top of the skull" (This is the language of the Sibert-O'Neill Report, of course. 1!)

Page 644: "The Navy doctors removed their X-rays from the opaque screen and their notebooks from the autopsy table."
