Welch Sees Nixon 7 After World Rule

BELMONT, Mass., Oct. 7 (UPI)—Robert Welch, founder and leader of the John Birch society, said in a newsletter that President Nixon is trying to use the presidency of the United States as a stepping stone to become the ruler of the world.

Welch, in a pamphlet mailed with the October bulletin of the Society, said Mr. Nixon could only achieve such a position with the approval and support of the Communist movement.

The statement was stronger than one Welch made in 1958 calling President Eisenhower an unwitting dupe of the Communist Party, since the Communists' ambitions were furthered while he was in office.

Welch said he drew his conclusion from the President's announced trip to mainland China, his actions "when he practically threw the 1960 election by doublecrossing his conservative following with regard to the party platform at the Republican convention," his monetary policy and appointment of "leftwingers" to his administration.
