Dear Mr. Frost,

I am writing to ask a copy of the transcript of former Attorney General Clark's remarks on your show tonight and for equal opportunity to present the other side of his erroneous and misleading comments about the murders of President Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King.

If you are concerned that there may not be substance to what I would say, I invite you here to see the extensive documentation in advance.

I have printed four books on the assassination of President Kennedy, have two others completed and have almost finished on on the murder of Dr. King.

The facts are entirely contrary to the representation of Mr. Clark. Despite his appearance as a man of deep concern for truth and justice, his own record as Attorney General is contrary to this. Should you prefer, I could air the consequences of that, with documentation coming from him and misrepresented by him, from one of the unprinted books.

I am not without experience on TV.

Should you be unwilling to offer the other side to your audience as a matter of simple fairness to it and to establishment of truth and responsibility toward a subject of major national interest and importance, which I prefer not to believe, then I make the request for equal time under the "fairness doctrine",

I do look forward to hearing from you. If you have any doubt about the genuineness of my information, I solicit your advance inquiry, for there will be no difficulty establishing that.
