

STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING OF MILITARY OBLIGATION ASSUMED BY ME UPON MY ENLISTMENT IN THE MARINE CORPS OR MARINE CORPS RESERVE

PLACE USMC RS DALLAS, TEXAS

DATE 18 FEBRUARY 1957

I, Roscoe Anthony WHITE, being an applicant for enlistment in the Marine Corps (Reserve), hereby state that there has been explained to me and that I fully understand that upon my enlistment I shall assume the obligations and responsibilities stated herein:

a. That upon my enlistment I assume a total of six year military obligation. Any portion of that 6-year period not served on active duty must be served as a member of the Marine Corps Reserve (unless I am sooner discharged by competent authority).

b. That upon my becoming a member of the Reserve (either by enlistment there in or transfer thereto from the Regular Marine Corps) I will be placed in the Ready Reserve.

c. That as a member of the Ready Reserve I may be required: (1) to participate in not less than 48 scheduled drill or training periods and to perform not more than 17 days of active duty for training each year, or: (2) perform annually not more than 30 days of active duty for training. If I fail to perform satisfactorily one or the other of the above in any year, I may be ordered, without my consent, to perform additional active duty for training for not more than 45 days.

d. That, except in time of war or national emergency, I will be transferred to the Standby Reserve if I am not serving on active duty and if my active duty service in the Ready Reserve totals not less than five years; and that, as a member of the Standby Reserve, I will not be subject to the reserve training requirements stated herein.

e. That, as a member of the Ready Reserve, I will be liable for involuntary call to active duty in time of future national emergency proclaimed by the President of the United States and may be required to serve for not more than 24 months; and that in time of national emergency or war declared by Congress of the United States, I may be required to serve for the duration of that national emergency or war and for six-months thereafter.

f. That as a member of the Standby Reserve, I will be liable for involuntary call to active duty ONLY in time of war or national emergency declared by the Congress of the United States.

In the event you, the designator, should die, the persons named in items 8, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18 will be notified. Should you become critically or seriously ill, or incapacitated to the extent that you cannot notify them, the person named in item 8 and your next of kin will be notified. If, for good reason, you do not desire any of the above persons notified, so indicate in "REMARKS" below and give the reason. Entry in item 8 does not effect payment of benefits or control of disposition of your remains in the event of your death. If necessary, continue any item in "REMARKS" but specify the particular item therein.

**Item 9.**—Enter the name, address, and relationship of beneficiary and alternate whom you desire to receive the 6 months' death gratuity in the event you are not survived by a spouse or eligible child. The person(s) named must be related to you by blood or marriage. Should you designate a person of more distant relationship than parents or brothers and sisters, the designated person will be required to furnish proof of dependency or insurable interest prior to payment of death gratuity.

**Item 10.**—If you have the maximum amount (\$10,000) of National Service Life Insurance or U. S. Government Life Insurance, enter "Not Applicable," followed by "NSLI" or "USGLI." (This includes those who have applied for waiver of premium under Sec. 622, Insurance Act of 1951 (65 Stat. 36; 38 U. S. C. 823)).

The Servicemen's Indemnity is payable only to persons within the following classes:

- (1) Spouse (husband or wife).
  - (2) Children. The term "children" includes natural children, adoptive children. Illegitimate children are included only if designated.
  - (3) Parents. The term "parents" includes natural parents, stepparents, adoptive parents or persons who stood in loco parentis to the insured at any time prior to entry into active service for a period of not less than 1 year. Unless designated otherwise by the serviceman the term "parent" includes only the mother and father who last bore that relationship to the serviceman.
  - (4) Brothers and sisters. The term "brothers and sisters" includes those of the half blood and those through adoption.
- If the designated beneficiary or beneficiaries do not survive the insured, or if none has been designated, the indemnity will be paid to the first eligible class of beneficiaries according to

the order set forth above and in equal shares if the class is composed of more than one person. Any person so named will be considered a principal beneficiary unless specifically designated as a contingent. While specific designation of beneficiaries is not mandatory, experience has proven it advisable that a beneficiary or beneficiaries be designated in each preparation of this form in order that the desires and intent of the member may be expressed. In case you do not wish to designate a beneficiary, you will record in your own handwriting in item 10 the following statement, IN FULL: "No designation. Order of preference specified in Servicemen's Indemnity Act of 1951 is desired."

**Item 11.**—Enter name and address of the beneficiary or beneficiaries whom you desire to receive any unpaid pay and allowances (Arrears of Pay) due you in the event of death. There are no restrictions on who may be designated as a beneficiary or beneficiaries to receive unpaid pay and allowances and once a designation has been made it is binding until superseded by the completion of a later DD Form 93-1.

**Item 12.**—The "Missing Persons Act" provides that pay and allowances continue to accrue to the pay account of any service member for the period he is missing or captured and may be paid to the dependents for support. This item reflects your desires and is used as a guide in the disposition of your pay. Allotments to dependents and insurance companies initiated prior to entering a missing status are continued in effect unless unusual circumstances indicate changes.

**Item 13.**—Disposition of personal effects will be made in accordance with the following: NAVY BuPers Manual, Chapter 9, Section 8, and BuS&A Manual, Vol. 1, Part C, Articles 13125-13137; MARINE CORPS, Chapter 54, Volume 2, MCM; and U. S. COAST GUARD, Volume 4 CG Compt. Manual.

# LOYALTY CERTIFICATE FOR PERSONNEL OF THE ARMED FORCES

**I. PROVISIONS.** The Department of Defense has the authority to establish procedures implementing the national policy relating to loyalty of persons entering on duty with the Armed Forces. This has been determined by proper authority to include restrictions as to certain standards of conduct and membership in, or sympathetic association with, certain organizations.

## STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

1. Conduct which may be considered as establishing reasonable grounds for imposing appropriate penalties shall include but is not limited to, one or more of the following:

- (a) Sabotage, espionage, or attempts or preparations therefor, or intimate and sympathetic associations with or voluntary assistance to persons who the subject of investigation has reasonable cause to believe may be spies or saboteurs.
- (b) Treason, sedition, or writings and acts which can reasonably be considered as intended to encourage seditious or treasonable opinions or actions.

(c) Advocacy of revolution or of force or violence to alter the existing constitutional form of government of the United States; advocacy of revolution or of force or violence to bring about economic, political, or social change.

(d) Intentional unauthorized disclosure to any person under circumstances which may indicate disloyalty to the United States, of documents or information of a classified or nonpublic character.

(e) Acting, attempting to act, or knowingly failing to act when such conduct is calculated to serve the interests of another government in preference to the interests of the United States of America.

## MEMBERSHIP IN OR ASSOCIATION WITH CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS

2. Associations which may be considered as establishing reasonable grounds for imposing appropriate penalties include but are not limited to membership in, affiliation with, or sympathetic association with, any foreign or domestic organization, association, movement, group or combination of persons having the following characteristics:

(a) Which practices, seeks to practice, or advocates either:

- (1) Denial, to any person, group of persons, or class of persons within the United States or territory subject to its jurisdiction, of any right or rights which the Federal Constitution guarantees or protects against encroachment by either or both Federal and State Government.

ments when such denial is attempted by force, violence, or intimidation, or;

- (2) Alteration of the existing form of government of the United States or territory subject to its jurisdiction, or of the existing economic, social, or political order within it when such alteration is through or with the aid of force, violence, or intimidation.

(b) Which is disclosed by investigation, or is designated by the Attorney General of the United States to be totalitarian, fascist, communist, or subversive, or as having adopted a policy of advocating or approving the commission of acts of force or violence to deny persons their rights under the Constitution of the United States, or as seeking to alter the form of government of the United States by unconstitutional means regardless of practice, advocacy, or nonadvocacy of any of the tenets set forth in 1 (a) and 1 (b) above.

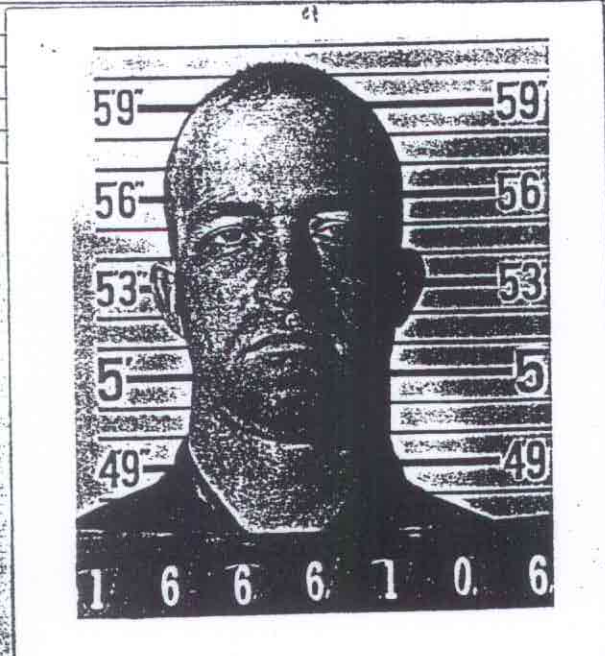

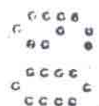
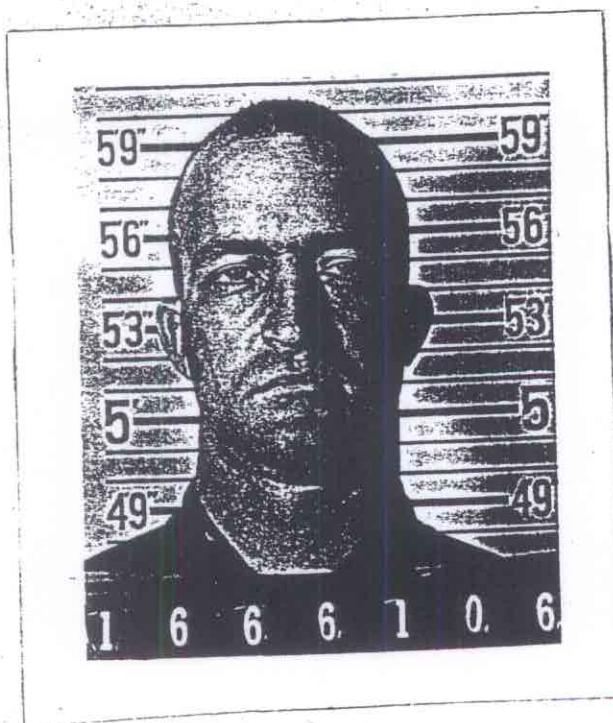
