He contends that the entire matter must be investigated in public, preferably by Congress. Weisberg commented that there is serious doubt concerning all conclusions in the Report and that the Report is replete with too many coincidences. He contends that the evidence clearly indicates that at least two individuals were involved in the assassination and that there is no proof that Oswald actually was in the sixth floor window of the Texas Depository Bookstone manufactured to the Report. Section Weisherg questioned the sight on the gun allegedly used by Oswald and said that the FRI could not even get the sight to function properly Be also commented that a different automobile was used in the re-enactment of the assassination and that the FDI reached conclusions without taking into consideration the different size of the car and the seats. Weisberg commented that one question which is still unanswered was volunteered by Mr. Hoover during his. testimony before the Commission and that was: "Why didn't the assassin short prior de the car turning left off of Mouston Street?" Weisberg commenter that Mr. Alloover answered this by saying: "There was a tree in the way"; however according to Weisberg, there are no trees on Houston Street.
