Dear Mr. Williams,

I write to thank you for taking the time to send encouragement.

I am continuing my work. Recently I have published three very limited editions, not commercially available because I cannot afford to print them. I am working on several other books. If and when these are printed, we will let you know.

The headlines and most news reports do not adequately reflect the New Orleans proceedings. There, for the first time, regardless of the too-numerous inadequacies, there resulted an official court record that is entirely destructive of the fake official report on the murder of the President.

This is the first time there was cross-examination on the basic fact. The Warren Report, even sheltered as it was by these inadequacies, could not survive. From this I think all of us who seek truth can take comfort.
