Dear Ed,

In your letter of 12/4/69 you referred to CIA funds, noting that Sarah Hughes and Leon Jaworski are among the directors of some. I have other notes of my own indicating another source is The Espionage Establishment, and I have an extensive but entirely unclassified file on these funds. I may or may not be able to find it without much, much time, and then I'll have to read through that enormity to find what I want. Perhaps you can save me what has become even more precious for me, time. I've begun writing again, and I've been starting at 4 a.m. again, which I know I should not. It is not yet five and before returning to that writing there are other letters I must write and some I have written.

My chief immediate interests are Jaworski (Hoblitzelle, as I recall) and Dean Storey, who may have no such connection, ditto Waggoner Carr, and what these funds may have done that is of special significance, particularly in espionage, if only in the use of students for such purposes.

If you could send copies of whatever you have fast, you could save me much time. I have to be away part of next week, and I want to complete the draft of a sample before then. If you can send this fairly promptly, I can have it on my return so that the beginning of the following week whatever you may be able to supply can be added before retyping. I'm submitting some sample chapters on a book proposal and because of unanticipated intrusions, I'm a week late now.

Hope you can find the time.
