

Sergeant PATRICK V. REAM, Dallas Police Department, advised that on March 24, 1964, at about 4:45 AM, PAYET PAIS, City Hall Night Telephone Operator, called him at his office, advised he had received a telephone call at the Bell Telephone Company and that KINGMAN wanted to talk to someone about the assassination of President KENNEDY. Sergeant REAM stated that he asked PAYET PAIS if KINGMAN was in his office and they should accept the call and PAYET PAIS said in talking with KINGMAN and the Victoria and Canada, operator, paid in talking with KINGMAN and the Victoria and Canada, operator, paid in accepting the collect call.

Sergeant REAM stated he authorized the operator to accept the collect call and KINGMAN said he was in Dallas on December 22, 1963, and had been in the United States since that date. This was the only time that he believed he got the Texas Telecommunications Building, according to Sergeant REAM, and he believed it was an appropriate opportunity with "wide-angle, angle lens."

KINGMAN stated he had been talking to his attorney, MURKIN, (presently deceased) and had been in Victoria, B.C., and never taken pictures to them. They had talked about the assassination and he had no desire to take any photographs.

DETAILS OF INTERVIEW

Reference is made to previous reports relative to Lee Harvey Oswald.

Omissions:

On 1-29-64 the following was reported to ALM Robert V. Morris, by Captain WILL MITCHELL, Dallas Police Department.

Lee Harvey Oswald in the first interview conducted by his agent, stated that he was working in the United States for the past two years and had never been in Mexico. He was not working at the present time. He was interviewed by Secret Service Agents and stated to the location of a telephone.

On 1-29-64 Mr. Jack Price, Detective, Dallas Police Department, stated that he was investigating the death of President John F. Kennedy and had been unable to identify the assassin.

On 1-29-64 Mr. Powell was interviewed relative to his location at the time of the assassination and his actions subsequent to the assassination. Mr. Powell stated that he was working for the State of Texas in the State Auditor's Office in Austin, Texas, the site of the assassination. Mr. Powell stated further that he had left the state and had then joined a group of Negroes who had come to the state to demonstrate against the results of the election. Mr. Powell was unable to furnish any information that the assassin had shot from the mailing room. Mr. Powell


