U. S. SENATE SELECT COMMITTEE
TO STUDY GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS
WITH RESPECT TO INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES (SSC)

Reference is made to SSC letter dated December 11, 1975, requesting access to various FBI materials relating to our investigation of Lee Harvey Oswald and/or the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Specifically, Item 15 of this referenced letter requested all materials pertaining to the meeting subsequent to November 24, 1963, and prior to the submission of the Bureau's initial report to the White House. This meeting is more fully described in the September 23, 1975, affidavit of former Special Agent (SA) Henry A. Schutz, in response to Item 5 of the SSC's request dated October 31, 1975. It is noted, the results of all interviews of Bureau officials and supervisory Agents conducted by the Inspection Division relative to Oswald's visit to our Dallas Office prior to the assassination were previously furnished to the SSC.

Enclosed herewith are the results of additional interviews of four individuals whom former SA Schutz recalled as possibly having attended this meeting, Supra. In addition, it was recalled that former Assistant to the Director Alan H. Belmont possibly attended this meeting. No attempt has been made to interview Mr. Belmont in this regard due to his ill health, which condition was previously brought to the attention of the SSC.
