This informative memorandum is to bring to notice unusual aspects relating to anticipated Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Activities (SSC) interview of SA [REDACTED]

Legal Counsel to Mr. J. B. Adams memorandum, 1/29/76, advised that Paul Wallach, SSC Staff Member, requested SA [REDACTED] be made available for Staff interview concerning his knowledge of the President Kennedy assassination.

Personnel file of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] no indication ever in Dallas Office or participated in the investigation of the Kennedy assassination. According to Supervisor P. V. Daly, Legal Counsel Division, to whom Wallach made the request, Daly has already discussed with Wallach the possibility that Wallach may have confused [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] with SA Kenneth Howe, [REDACTED] who was a Supervisor in Dallas at the time of the assassination. Wallach indicated he is aware these are two separate individuals and it is the [REDACTED] he desires to interview but Wallach would not indicate any further as to the specific information he expects [REDACTED] to have.

to alert him of the SSC interest in interviewing [REDACTED]

On 2/3/76, Supervisor S. F. Phillips of the Senstudy 75 Project telephonically brought the current matter to the attention of SAC Bill Williams, Kansas City, who advised that he anticipated no problem whatsoever should the SSC interview [REDACTED]. Williams also wondered why the SSC would choose [REDACTED] who, to the best information available, did not participate in the Kennedy assassination investigation. The only conjecture which Williams had, and which Daly and Phillips likewise have, is that [REDACTED] name may have come up in connection with the SSC interest in SA James P. Hosty, Jr., who did participate in the assassination investigation and who has for some time also been assigned to Kansas City. Williams said that he has talked with [REDACTED] on a number of occasions since [REDACTED] on 12/6/75 and it appears that [REDACTED] is making excellent progress and that an interview of him should not adversely affect him. Williams will alert [REDACTED] to the SSC interest to insure that, if [REDACTED] is contacted directly by the SSC, [REDACTED] will immediately advise Williams and in turn the Bureau will be advised.

On 2/5/76, SAC Williams telephonically advised Supervisor S. F. Phillips that he has had a chat with [redacted] to alert him to the possible SSC interview and [redacted] told Williams that he knew absolutely nothing about the Kennedy assassination investigation.

[redacted] Williams also indicated that he had talked to [redacted] for about 10 minutes purposely in order to further assess the impact the interview might have on [redacted] and Williams reiterated his earlier opinion that such an interview would not be disturbing to [redacted]. As the matter stands, if [redacted] is contacted directly by an SSC representative, [redacted] will inquire as to the subject of the interview and, if it is the Kennedy assassination, will strongly point out his lack of knowledge. [redacted] will, of course, immediately contact Williams who will then contact the Legal Counsel Division. b6
