Informant advised that he continually received from  
friends in the news business that CLAY BERTRANDS was arrested  
about three years ago in New Orleans and the case is still  
open. [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] The case still is  
supposed to be open according to information being received  
by informant from news sources.

CARLOS BRINGUIER telephonically contacted the New  
Orleans Office this date and advised he had a taped interview  
with KBTU, Channel 9, Denver, Colorado. A Mr. TAYLOR and a  
Mr. KEN HARMON talked with him.

BRINGUIER advised that apparently there were some  
words missing from his conversation recorded on the tape and  
he received a call from Mr. TAYLOR and Mr. HARMON telling him  
that they had a private investigator review the tape and they  
were under the impression that BRINGUIER's telephone was  
tapped.
