Probers to See Oswald Home, End Orleans Visit

Investigators will complete the New Orleans phase of their probe into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy this afternoon when they inspect a Magazine st. apartment which Lee Harvey Oswald occupied in 1963.

The two investigators for the special presidential fact-finding commission studying the Kennedy slaying have no reason for wanting to see Oswald's old home.

They interviewed only one person this morning.

He was John Murrel, 3417 Iberville, identified as a cousin of Oswald.

Yesterday investigators interviewed 21 persons and on Monday questioned five others.

Oswald, the accused assassin of President Kennedy, was slain as Dallas police tried to move him from one jail to another. He was a native and former resident of New Orleans.

HE WAS BORN in New Orleans on Oct. 18, 1939, but his family moved away a short time later. The Oswalds returned to the Crescent City in 1964, but left again the following year. Oswald returned briefly in 1963.

Albert Jenner and James Liebler, who took depositions from the witnesses, identified only nine of those with whom they talked. The others asked not to be named, the probers said.

Among those who gave statements yesterday were Mrs. Bennieria Smith, 3531 D'Almeida, Chalmette; William E. Wulf, 2407 Annunciation, and

Edward Voebel, 4916 Canal, all identified as classmates of Oswald when he attended Beauregard Junior High School here in 1954.

OTHERS WERE Mrs. Edward Boudreaux, 831 Pauline, and Mrs. Mildred Peterman, 1012 Bartholomew, former neighbors of the Oswalds.

Also interviewed were police Lt. Francis Martello, who participated in the arrest of Oswald here in August, 1963; Carlos Bringuier, 501 Adele, and William Stuckey, 2317 State, who engaged Oswald in a television debate on Cuba, and Mr. and Mrs. Julian Evans, 1910 Prytanis, described as friends of Oswald's mother.

Investigators said Wulf told them Oswald espoused communism when he was 16 years old and once said he would join a Communist cell if he could find one.
