Synopsis:

On P/17/63, an incoherent letter was received addressed to Mr. HOOVER, FBI, NYC, and signed by JORGE MORALES, 310 W. 95th St., NYC. MORALES interviewed 12/23/63, and stated that he had written the letter to express hatred for the US Government, the President, and the FBI. MORALES stated that he wished to be deported. On 1/11/64, a similar incoherent letter addressed to Mr. HOOVER, FBI, NY, Congress of the US, Mr. President, HOOVER, NYC and bearing the return address of JORGE MORALES, 310 W. 95th St., Manhattan, NY, was received. In this letter MORALES stated he plotted the "assassination" of President KENNEDY. Results of investigation set forth.

Details:

On December 17, 1963, a letter addressed to "Mr. Hoover, FBI, New York City", and signed JORGE MORALES, was received at the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This letter read as follows:

"Mr. Hoover: F.B.I. New York

"United: ia beautifor Word!
Never a integral reazon in here.
I pas hongue in U.S.A.
To be good is in here stupid tobe.
Ente of moral is this country.
Dont not Wahit.
Sorry....i
Thru is all this.
A pruff is the J.F.K. case....
Thenk for you attention to this leatter.
End of bat's will to be not hijocrit.
Sorry, sorry and sorry.

Sincery
Jorge Morales
Note: I take to be deport to Cuba."

Jorge Morales, Apartment 61, 210 West 95th Street, New York, New York, after being advised that he did not have to make any statement, that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law, and that he had the right to consult an attorney, stated as follows:

On December 16, 1963, he mailed a letter to Mr. Hoover, Federal Bureau of Investigation, New York. In this letter he wished to convey his hatred for the United States Government, the President of the United States and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He stated that he wished to be deported to Cuba as soon as possible. He stated that he is a carpenter but has been unemployed for several weeks. He requested that he be arrested and immediately deported to Cuba. Subject advised that he entered the United States from Cuba in December, 1956. He stated that he was not a citizen but did not have an Immigration and Naturalization Service Identification Card in his possession. He exhibited a Cuban passport which reflected the number 49803. Subject refused to furnish any additional information and the interview was terminated at his request.

The following description of subject was obtained through interview and observation:

Subject is a White male, 5'8" tall, height, 160 lbs., eyes and hair, dark brown, approximate age, 38 years.

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On December 23, 1963.

New York City, advised that he has frequently observed JORGE MORALES in the apartment building and it was his impression that MORALES is mentally disturbed or a drug addict.

On January 11, 1964, a letter addressed to Mr. HOOVER, Federal Bureau of Investigation, New York, Congress of the United States, Mr. President, HOOVER, Federal Bureau of Investigation, New York City, was received. It was post-marked at New York, New York, January 9, 1964. The envelope contained a return address of JORGE MORALES, 310 West 95th Street, apartment 61, Manhattan, New York. The letter is dated January 8, 1964 and was incoherent. The letter was translated from Spanish. The salutation indicated that the writer was addressing himself to the President of the United States of America. He started out that the ommission of the word "Honorable" from the salutation is deliberate because he does not consider the addressee worthy of honor.

The writer describes himself as a bricklayer who successfully plotted the assassination of President KENNEDY. He claims he was able to do this by investing nine cents in a post card to the United Nations; five cents for the card and four cents for the stamp.

He stated that he had President KENNEDY assassinated because the President failed to pay him \$300,000 for a report on Cuba's "Moral Missiles" that he allegedly sent via the Spanish Embassy.

He challenges the addressee to have him disposed of in the usual fashion: in a dark alley, with the executioner to be later executed by another gangster.

Along with the addressee, he disparages the whole American nation. Among other things, he says: "Let me have my money and I will get out of this country never to set foot again in this sewer."

A separate note attached to the letter reads: "Mr. Hoover: I could not write this letter in a different way, because I would feel like a coward. I am decent, but I am a man. Do what you please."

This letter also contains three cryptic lines. They read: "By ase Ssd AylcdmsmncejsmdpeejidssN. Amen Jesus.".

Sources and informants familiar with certain aspects of Cuban activities in the New York City area were contacted during December, 1963, and January, 1964 with negative results.

Naturalization Service, advised he could locate no record for the subject.

On January 20, 1964 the files of the Bureau of Special Services, the Bureau of Criminal Identification and the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were checked with negative results regarding the subject.
