

At this time he was also furnished his assignment, which was to obtain a job im industry, if possible, and associate with as many Negroes as possible. He was to determine through these contacts names of Negroes and/or white persons who would be willing to go to extremes to create more racial disturbances. He believed that because of this there would be possible disturbances on election day, November 4, 1964, and on November 22, 1964, the first anniversary of the KENNEDY assassination. He added that the purpose of determining these names was so that they could be recontacted and further developed and the effort was directed towards the throwing of a wedge between the white and the Negro Americans as so to possibly create a civil war.

broadcast in French information concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY. He asked what was being said because of difficulty in understanding the French and asked him to switch to a German station. Explained the details of the assassination and told him with a seeming happiness at the results.

He realized that could not have been there on the day of the assassination because of the time and the time zones involved, but that he could have been there on November 21, 1963.
