### OFFICIAL BYLAWS AND DELEGATE REGISTRATION

PREPARED FOR AT-LARGE DELEGATES

ARTICLE 1:

The Platform Planning Committee

Section 1

The Republican Party Platform Planning Committee (hereafter the Platform Committee) is established by the Republican

Presidential Task Force.

ARTICLE 2:

Delegates-At-Large

Section 1

The Platform Committee shall consist of DELEGATES-AT-LARGE selected from Republican Party Membership rolls in

each of the 50 States.

Section 2

DELEGATES-AT-LARGE will serve terms to end August 31,

1996.

ARTICLE 3:

Additional Duties

Section 1

DELEGATES-AT-LARGE will be responsible for the plank-byplank construction of the Republican Presidential Task Force Party Platform. Delegates will execute this duty through the completion of a series of written surveys, telephone interviews, and, if required, meetings with state and local Republican

officials.

Section 2

DELEGATES-AT-LARGE will receive a summary of Platform

Committee Proceedings, and all survey and canvass results.
