Brennan, Jr. SUBJECT: MARGUERITE-G--OSWALD ALLEGATION OF FBI SURVEILLANCE The White House has furnished the attached wire from Marguerite Oswald, presumably the mother of the assassin of President John F. Kennedy, in which she addresses the President and states she understands that the Vice President will be in Dallas for the next few days. The wire, dated May 21, 1967, at Ft. Worth, Texas, charges that surveillance requested by FBI started at noon and "twice before I was subjected to this same kind of treatment which I consider police state tactics."
