[REDACTED] Cincinnati
Police Department, at 11:15 P.M., February 28, 1967,
telephonically advised that he had received a complaint
from the WLW-TV Station. [REDACTED] advised that
[REDACTED] WLW-TV, had received the
call at approximately 10:53 P.M., and advised that the call
was from an anonymous female who stated, "If you put that
Communist on, a bomb will go off in your station at 11:00
P.M." The caller apparently referred to Marguerite Oswald,
mother of Lee Harvey Oswald, who was in Cincinnati, Ohio,
on February 28, 1967.

[REDACTED] advised that no patrolmen
were dispatched to the scene of WLW-TV, since it was
apparent that this was a hoax type bomb threat, and it
was well after 11:00 P.M. before the Police Department
had received this information.

[REDACTED] advised that there are no
religious or racial problems at WLW-TV, Cincinnati, Ohio.
