## INFORMATIVE NOTE

New Orleans previously advised that the New Orleans District Attorney's Office had been in contact with the United States Attorney in New Orleans concerning the subpoenaing of Special Agents Regis L. Kennedy and Reed W. Jensen as witnesses for the State against Dean A. Andrews.

The District Attorney's Office was aware of interview reports available to the public in the Archives which show that Kennedy and Jensen interviewed Andrews following the Kennedy assassination. Andrews told the Warren Commission of having been phoned by a Clay Bertrand who requested that Andrews represent Lee Harvey Oswald following the assassination. He later said he must have dreamed the incident. He has since told several conflicting statements concerning the mysterious Bertrand and as a result has been charged with perjury.

Since the United States Attorney has stated that Agent Jensen may leave the State of Louisiana, as indicated in attached, he will be permitted to depart on annual leave.

We are following this matter closely with the Department.
