CEASSINATION OF JURN F. KENNEDY FORTHODMING ARTICLE IN "NEW YORK TIMES" CONCERNING LEE HAMVEY CEWALD CASSPORT MATTER

SAC Gordon Shanklin, Dallas, stated he had been contacted yesterday by former Agent John W. Fain in connection with an inquiry Fain received from thick librated of the Washington Bureau of the "New York Times." Horrock had contacted Fain concerning a memorandum from Director Hoover in June, 1980, relating to possibly another individual having used the passport of Lee Harvey Cowald. Chanklin pointed out that former SA Fain had interviewed Cawald on two occasions prior to the assassination with respect to Oswald's defection to Russia in 1989 and his subsequent return to this country. Apparently the communication in question dealt with a check of passport records concerning Oswald's trip out of this country, and SA Fain's name was listed as the reporting agent in reports diaseminated to the Warren Commission which are now stored in the Maticael Archives. Apparently Horrock was reviewing this material in the Archives in Washington. According to Shanklin, Fain informed Horrock that he would have no comment concerning the results of any investigation he might have conducted for the FBI when he was on its active roles.

Former Assistant to the Director Cartha DeLoach ecatasted my office into yesterday to advise that he had received a stailar inquiry from forcest. Horrock stated that indicas doing some research for enother writer for the "Times," Ben Franklin, who was doing a story with respect to the unleged stolen passport of Lee Harvey Cawald which might possibly indicate there were two Cawalds and would raise the question as to whether or not the right one was arrested in connection with the assassination of President Remarky. It. Deloach stated he advised Horrock that he had no information to give him concerning the story that he was doing but stated that the FBI conducted a most Chorough investigation concerning the assassination, the results of which were formished to the Watten Commission.
