Enclosures all pertain to information furnished by one James W. Gallaher, 4960 E. 5th Ave., Anchorage, Alaska. A search of Bureau files fails to disclose any identifiable information concerning Gallaher.

Recipients are instructed to search indices concerning Gallaher. It is noted he claims to have reported to the FBI in San Francisco and Seattle in 1968 that he overheard a conversation between three men in 1963, (Clay Shaw, Oswald, and an unknown individual), which he interprets to have a bearing on the subsequent assassination of President Kennedy.

Furnish results of indices search and any file review to Bureau. Conduct no further inquiry at this time.

Handle promptly.
