Bunker Theft. Rhodes Is Told

An affidayit filed with new extradition/papers sent to Columbus, Ohio, claims that Gordon Novel admitted his part in a burglary of a munitions bunker in Houma in 1961.

· The new extradition papers were sent to Ohio Gov. James Rhodes as part of Orleans Parish Dist. Attorney 'Jim Garrison's efforts to bring Novel back to Louisiana on a burglary conspiracy charge.

Garrison wants Novel in connection with his investigation of President Kennedy's assassination.

James L/ Alcock, an assistant district attorney, said in the affidavit:

"The said Gordon Novel responded to questioning by Jim Garrison, district attorney for the Parish of Orleans, and William Gurvich, investigative aide to am Garrison, that he and the parties named herein did is fact commit the conspiracy and burglary outlined above."

In the body of the affidavit, Alcock declared that Novel, Sergio Arcacha/ Smith, David W. Ferrie and other unitamed persons "did conspire, agree, and combine/to burglarize a munitions banker located in

Houma, La. He said the conspiracy was at the home of Arcacha.
