HE MAY BE THE NEXT AG

Next Attorney General of the United States may be Leon Jaworski, Houston attorney; long-time friend of President Johnson.

If the President is re-elected . . .

If Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy resigns, as he indicates . . .

Then Mr. Johnson, who prides himself on being ready with replacements, is likely to name Mr. Jaworski.

The Houston attorney is a former president of the State Bar of Texas; was Army prosecutor at the Nuremberg trials.

In 1960, as lawyer for Texas Democrats when Republicans tried to block certification of the state's electoral votes for the Kennedy-Johnson ticket, Mr. Jaworski out-manuevered opposition.

He was high on the Kennedy list of potential appointees to the U. S. Supreme Court, but friends say he's lukewarm about judicial service.

Attorney General Kennedy picked him in 1962—when he wanted a lawyer outside the Justice Department—to prosecute Gov. Ross Barnett of Mississippi on criminal contempt-of-court charges. That case is still pending, with the Supreme Court due to rule on whether it should be heard by a jury. Mr. Jaworski argued it should not.
