BACKGROUND

Walter Winchell's column in the 7-6-64 issue of "The New York Journal-American" carried a statement reporting that captioned individual was on the "LBJOB List" to replace Bobby Kennedy. The Director has requested a summary on Jaworski.

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

An article appearing in "The Washington Daily News" of 3-28-64 reported that captioned individual, a long-time friend of President Johnson, may be the next Attorney General if President Johnson is re-elected and Attorney General Kennedy resign as he has indicated he will do. The Director inquired at that time, "What do our files show on Jaworski?"

The attached memorandum dated 3-30-64 on Leon Jaworski was prepared in response to the Director's inquiry.

References containing information received since attached memorandum w prepared on Mr. Jaworski merely reveal that he was present when SA's John L. Quigley and James P. Hosty, Jr., appeared before the President's Commission to give testimony concerning Oswald. Mr. Jaworski was there in his capacity as a representative of the Attorney General's Office of the State of Texas. (105-82555-3602 and 3609)
