INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA - RUSSIA

On May 5, 1964, SA John L. Quigley, New Orleans Office appeared before the President's Commission to give testimony concerning Agent Quigley's interview of Oswald at New Orleans. Louisiana, on 8-10-63.

Present were the following Commission members: Chief Justice Earl Warren, Senator John Sherman Cooper, Congressman Gerald R. Ford, Mr. John J. McCloy, and Mr. Allen Dulles. Also present were Mr. J. Lee Rankin, General Counsel, together with his staff members: Mr. Samuel Stern, Mr. Norman Redlich and Howard P. Willens. In addition to these, there was present a Mr. Leon Jaworski, representative of the Attorney General's Office of the State of Texas.

The questioning of Agent Quigley was directed primarily by Mr. Stern, however, the various members of the Commission, from time to time, interjected questions of Agent Quigley to clarify various phases of the interrogation. Mr. Stern during the questioning specifically queried Agent Quigley as to whether or not consideration was ever given by Agent Quigley's securing the services of Oswald as an informant or whether it was suggested to Oswald that he subsequently contact the FBI. Agent Quigley testified unequivocally that no attempt or consideration had been given to securing the services of Oswald as an informant nor had Oswald been told to contact the FBI for any reason.

Mr. Stern during questioning inquired if during interview of Oswald, Agent Quigley noted anything which would indicate that Oswald was dangerous or could be considered as potentially dangerous. Agent Quigley made it completely clear that nothing along this line was noted.
