Texas Readies Own Report on JFK's Murder

ATLANTIC CITY—Texas will have its own detailed report on the events surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy to be preserved forever for historians, it was learned Saturday.

Texas Atty. Gen. Waggoner Carr, an early arrival here for the Democratic National Convention, disclosed he is writing such a report.

He is being assisted by his two special counsels, Dean Robert Storey of Dallas and Leon Jaworski of Houston. Storey is a past president of the American Bar Association and both Storey and Jaworski have been presidents of the Texas Bar Association.

CITES PURPOSE

Carr's purpose in writing a report separate from the one by the Warren Commission is to leave a record that Texas conducted its own investigation of the Kennedy murder and the killing of Lee Harvey Oswald.

Although Carr and other local and state officials made all of the information they had available to the Warren Commission, Carr believes it is possible the Texas report may include some

things which will not be published in the commission's report.

At least it will be a record of what Texas state and local authorities did and the information they uncovered.

DIDN'T SIT BY

For one thing, it will show that Texas law enforcement officials didn't sit by while the federal government did everything, Carr suggested.

The Carr report will be preserved in Austin in the state archives.

Carr made almost a dozen trips to Washington while the Warren Commission held hearings and said he heard about 70 per cent of all the testimony given before the commission. Either Storey or Jaworski or both heard the rest, he said.
