Sorensen Raps Establishment On Law, Order

NEW YORK, Sept. 26 (AP)
—Theodore C. Sorensen, aide
to the late President John F.
Kennedy, said today the major
obstacle to law and order in
the United States comes from
those who exercise authority
rather than those who challenge it.

Sorensen told a convocation of the American Management Association, "We have paid comparatively little attention to a similar lack of support for our law enforcement system from those whom we classify as lawmakers," he said.

He said "two of our three presidential contenders have maligned the Federal judiciary and directly or indirectly threatened its independence." Sorensen has endorsed Vice President Humphrey.
