

After account of the Hunt-Liddy political operations for the paranoids in the White House started appearing, the NAACP Legal ~~and~~ Defense and Educational Fund, Inc., concluded that the burglarizing of its offices at 10 Columbus Circle, New York City, was another White House bag job. In its quarterly publication Equal Justice it later reported that the night of this burglary, that of September 3-4, 1971, coincided with the Hunt-Liddy return/ ^{to Washington} from their breaking into the offices of Ellsberg's psychiatrist by way of a New York City detour. Direct flights from Los Angeles to Washington are frequent. There was no need to take the extra time except for a purpose.

At that time the Legal Defense Fund was defending Nixon "enemies" like Bobby Seale, the contempt aspect of ^{Black Panther} ~~in~~ the Chicago conspiracy case in which he was acquitted, and black New York Times reporter Earl Caldwell, who was under charges in San Francisco because he adhered to the reportorial tradition of refusing to disclose his sources inside the Panthers.

Jack Greenberg, Director-Counsel of the Legal Defense Fund, noting reports that Barker, Martinez and DeDiego had made the identical detour as Hunt and Liddy on their return to Miami from Los Angeles, wrote Silbert and Dash but to no end. There was no charge in this break-in.

Nor did Greenberg report, months later, that he had received assurances of a thorough investigation and proof that the charges were not true.

The only fair interpretation is that both the prosecution and the Ervin committee joined in suppressing proof of this crime as they did in others.

In this they were joined by other committees. The so-called CIA "oversight" subcommittee of the Senate Military Affairs Committee suppressed proof that this same gang of Nixon thugs broke into the Chilean Embassy. John Dean spilled it. And the Ervin committee knew it from reading the secret transcript of the secret hearing presided over by Missouri Senator Stuart Symington.
