I left him several brief summaries, which he had earlier requested, and I'm to see him about them early next week. If Doubleday doesn't want to do the book he is next sending it to Morrow, where he also has a good connection, both personal and business. I could never get an agent with better connections and able to get more speed (six weeks reading time is considered good). So, briefly, that's it for the moment.
