The Vietcong statement reaffirms that its 5-point program for ending the war is still the basis for any peace talks. Among other things, the program calls for withdrawal of American troops from South Vietnam. The statement was broadcast by the clandestine Liberation Radio and implied, Communist-leaning journalist Wilfred Burchett reporter, that Washington should not take recent "halt-bombings-fortalks offers" as a sign of weakness by North Vietnam or the Vietcong.

North Vietnam's official news agency denied that supplies from the Soviet Union have been held up by Communist China. The Soviet government newspaper Izvestia has accused China of interfering with aid destined for North Vietnam.
