SUBJECT: Possible Other Associates of Jack Ruby.

I. Association Proposed by Ademarstein Bullock

Mr. Bay Robert Bullock, resident in Houston, Texas, of calling him to Fidel Castro, has stated that in approximately April 1960, when he had received considerable notoriety in Cuba because of his anti-activities and relationship with Fidel Castro, he was contacted by a man identifying himself as Ademarstein. This individual telephoned him once and met with him personally on another occasion. In one of the conversations, Ademarstein stated that he had options on ships which were in Switzerland, etc., and that he desired to arrange a sale to Castro. On the other occasion, Ademarstein stated that he was representing a man in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and that he was desirous of obtaining the unknown sum of money from the U.S. in return therefor. Ademarstein mentioned sums of \$10,000 and \$25,000 in some conversations. He further stated that Ademarstein is identical to Jack Ruby.

Ruby has corroborated independently that, prior to the time that Castro fell into favor in the United States, he had been interested in selling ships to Cuba. Ruby stated that he contacted a man in Puerto Rico, etc., in order to accomplish this desire. The FBI has been unable to identify anyone named in the sale of arms to Cuba who might be identical to the person named Davis.

Ruby also stated that he visited Louis J. Unterman in Havana, Cuba during April, 1960, and April 1961. He stated that a man named Davis, who was a member of the Bureau of the People's Commission for Defense of Democracy, approached him in Cuban Cuba and asked him if he would be willing to help him in his efforts to obtain ships for Castro. Ruby stated that he agreed to do this and that he helped him in his efforts to obtain ships for Castro. The purpose and strength of Kelly's group in Cuba are not definitely clear. After returning to Mexico, known in this file as in 1957, for about ten days, Kelly, president of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, flew there three times to Mexico from Miami on the night of September 18, 1957 and returned to New Orleans on September 19, 1957. Kelly has not yet given any trip, unless it is the trip in which Kelly made. It is also known that he has been to other countries in the fall of 1957, including the island of a Caribbean Colony; however, it is not known that others he made be carrying such a trip.

Kelly also has exhibited some sophistication with respect to the various political groups concerned with Cuban affairs. For example, at the press conference which District Attorney Harry Gold held in the late evening of November 2nd, Gold stated that Caudillo was a member of the "Free Cuban Committee." Some time ago newspaper reporter had informed that Kelly interrupted Gold when he made that statement and pointed out that Caudillo was a member of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee and that there was a great difference between the Free Cuban Committee and the FPC.

On December 26, 1958, agents of the United States Secret Service were contacted by a reliable informant in Chicago who advised that he had been contacted by certain persons interested in purchasing arms for anti-Justice Cuban groups and that the person who contacted the informant had stated "our leaders are mostly Jews and we need no (they) get rid of Kennedy, we'll have plenty of money." The informant later started Secret Service agents to further meetings with the persons with whom he had been in contact. One of the Cuban involved in this group is a member of the 19th of November movement and another is a member of the Directory of Cuban Revolutionaries (DCR). The 19th of November was originally came to the United States on July 6, 1959 and went immediately to Dallas, Texas where he was employed by the G. J. Mexican Building Company. He has retained his contacts with Mr. G. J. Murphy. The Secret Service is continuing to establish an undercover relationship with this Cuban group and we have asked that the Commission be kept informed on activities in Chicago.

## II. Economic

Six or eight different rummels link Kelly to Cuba. An FBI informant in Mexico says Kelly was a gun runner to Cuba in the early 1950's. He can claim this for himself, not directed by the FBI, because under 2015 in his book of Cuban gun running activities in 1950, he states he received a piece of the same offered in 1950 from his name to a man in Mexico named Kelly, a gun runner of the anti-Justice Cuban group with a boat load of guns. A prostitute, formerly employed by Kelly as an inside informant, claims that in 1951 her husband and Kelly purchased an engine, which is right off Mexico for sale to an anti-Justice Cuban group. The woman alleges that Kelly visited Cuba in 1950 and obtained a boat in Havana. She further claims that Kelly also gave her father Kelly and himself a bullet on a piece of paper which said "I am the 19th of November" and a picture of the 19th of November on the bullet.
