INTERNAL SECURITY - RUSSIA

Reference is made to my letter to you dated March 6, 1964, captioned "Yuri Ivanovich Nosenko, Espionage - Russia," and your memorandum to Mr. Thomas L. Hughes, The Director of Intelligence and Research, Department of State, dated February 18, 1964, captioned "Assassination of President John F. Kennedy - Verification of Lawry in 'Historic Diary'."

Your memorandum of reference contains a recommendation to the Department of State to search the Embassy and Consular records in Moscow to identify the elderly American hospitalized at the end of October, 1939, and possibly registered with the Embassy as a tourist. Your request was based on a reference in Oswald's diary to an elderly American at the hospital" under the date of October 26, 1959.

Your attention is called to the excissive to my reference and specifically to the last packgraph of page two and continuing on page three wherein is set forth information as to Oswald's hospitalization in Mosey and, particularly, the believed identity of the hospital. This information may assist you in your continuing efforts to interpret available material relating to Oswald's activities abroact.

With regard to your recommendation to the Department of State in your memorandum of reference, this Eureau has no objection to your furnishing the information referred to herein regarding Oswald's hospitalization to the Department of State for its assistance.
